Great Eastern Mail—Closes every day (Sunday excepted) at 2 o'clock P. M. and on Sunday such letters as are dropped into the office before 1 o'clock, P. M. will be forwarded. Arrives (daily) at 5 o'clock, A. M.

Great Southern Mail—Mails for Washington City, Virginia, North-Carolina, South-Carolina and Georgia, close daily at 5 o'clock, A. M. Arrive daily at 2 o'clock, P. M.

Mails for Tennessee, Mississippi territory and New Orleans—Close on Monday and Wednesday at 5 o'clock, A. M. Arrive Friday and Saturday at 2 o'clock, P. M.

Mails for Kentucky state, Indiana territory, Illinois and Ohio state west of the river Muskingum—Close Sunday and Thursday at 5 o'clock, A. M. Arrival uncertain.

Belle-Air Mail—Closes every Friday at 2 o'clock, P. M. Arrives every Sunday at 5 o'clock, A. M.

Mails for Brick Meeting and Rising Sun—Close every Saturday at 2 o'clock, P. M. Arrive every Thursday at 5 o'clock, A. M.

Mails for Warwick, Head of Sassafras, George Town Cross Roads, Head of Chester, Sudler's Cross Roads, Nine Bridges, and Bridge-town in Maryland—Close on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 2 o'clock, P. M. Arrive Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at 5 o'clock, A. M.

Rock Hall Mail.—Mails for Rock Hall, Chester Town, Church Hill, Centreville, Queens Town, Broad Creek and Beaver Dam—Close every Friday and Sunday at 7 o'clock, A. M. Arrive Tuesday and Saturday.
