To each of these districts are assigned a com-  
 manding officer of the army of the United States,  
 and a competent staff.

The following rules are prescribed with regard  
 to militia drafts.

1st. All militia detachments in the service of the  
 United States, must be made under the requisition  
 of some officer of the United States (regularly au-  
 thorised to make such requisition) on the executive  
 authority of the state, or of the territory from which  
 the detachments shall be drawn.

2d. In these requisitions shall be expressed the  
 number of privates, non-commissioned and commis-  
 sioned officers required; which shall be in the  
 same proportions to each other, as obtain in the re-
