The following is the substance of the Assay Law:

Sil. a loy

All manufactured silver ware over 5 11 oz 1 oz penny wts. offered for sale, to be stamped by the assay master with the city stamp, offenders violating the law to pay 100 dol's. or 6 months imprisonment, and forfeiture of the article offered for sale.

Every silversmith or worker in silver, to send from time to time, with the silver to be stamped, a note in writing, containing the day of the month, year, christian and surname of the worker, and place of abode, to be entered on the assayer's book, which must be left monthly at the Mayor's office for inspection, under penalty of 25 dolls. or imprisonment not more than six months, or until paid.

Standard silver, Troy wt. 11 lbs. 1 lb. Fine for forging city stamp and making use thereof, 500 dolls. and imprisonment for not less than one, nor more than five years, and until the fine be paid,

in the penitentiary.

Assayer's fees—six cents per ounce of Silver.—Assayer to refuse his stamp, until fees be paid, and the silver be marked with the initials of the maker's name.
