At 4 D <sup>o</sup> W <sup>z</sup> At 6 <sup>20</sup> weighed & made sail on the larboard Tack. D <sup>o</sup> W <sup>z</sup> At 8 <sup>30</sup> Tacked At 9 Set T. g <sup>d</sup> Sails At 10 <sup>30</sup> Tacked At 11 <sup>30</sup> Shortened sail & came too with the small bower in 17 fms Noon D <sup>o</sup> W <sup>z</sup> . <u>Sharp's Island ENE 5 miles</u> PM Fresh Breezes Squally. Got a spar on board for the Main yard. Boats employed getting the Ankers & Hawsers. Shot were left on board when the Ship got off the ground. At 4 D <sup>o</sup> W <sup>z</sup> . Employed setting up the New Top Mast rigging. Opened a Cask of Flour 146 lbs.
	SSE	Ans'd - 66 at single anchor in Hearing Cove	At 6 D <sup>o</sup> W <sup>z</sup> rather. Hove short. At 6 <sup>15</sup> weighed & made sail per Sig <sup>l</sup> , wore round on the Larboard Tack & hove too under the Commodore Stern. At 7 obs <sup>d</sup> Devastation bear up. At 8 D <sup>o</sup> W <sup>z</sup> at 9 <sup>30</sup> observed <u>the Devastation to anchor</u> . Shortened sail & came too with the small B <sup>z</sup> in 4 1/2 fms. Sent boat manned & armed to the shore in C <sup>o</sup> with the Boats of the Squadron. Midnight D <sup>o</sup> W <sup>z</sup> .
