Sir,
Having appointed a Commodore (Capt Norton)
& a Lieutenant to *Hislop Manly*, in the room of the
former Pilot of that Ship, sent to the Lakes in Canada,
I request that you will be pleased to forward them to St. John's
for the purpose of joining her as speedily as possible and
give them every assistance in equipping the *Manly* for
sea, as she is of the description of Vessels I shall much
stand in need of very shortly. When she is ready, direct
her Commodore to proceed to join the Senior Officer in
Boston Bay, sending ^{thither} also all such ships as you
can spare to assist in the Blockading of that Port, as well
as the Port to the Northward of it. You will be pleased to
give directions that four Supernumeraries on board the
Receiving Ship at Halifax, belonging to Mrs. Lapham, be sent
to the *Manly* as part of her complement & be allowed to go
with Capt. Norton to St. John's.
