Understanding that a number of British North
American Seamen would be induced to volunteer on board
His Majesty's Ships serving upon this Station could
they be assured of not being removed from hence.

I have directed that encouragement be offered
such as are desirous of entering, by assuring them
that without unavoidable necessity they shall not
be sent from this Command & when this may
occur they shall be returned to the North American
Stations by the earliest opportunity, together with their
receiving their pay at the end of their service either
from the Naval Storekeeper at Halifax or the one
at this Port. I have to request therefore your will be
pleased to authorize the Naval Storekeeper at Halifax
to pay to such Seamen as may produce certificates
