Commodore Evans the Superintendent of the Naval
Works carrying on here, having represented to me that he
cannot obtain any Office for building the Naval Hospital
ordered to be established at the Island called Saline
& that as the ^{Lease} of the Naval Hospital expires in a
few months & the Proprietors refusing to continue the same
the sick of the Squadron can no longer be accommodated
here. And as the Commodore has shown me a plan
for an Hospital which combines many advantages & may be
in part finished during this present year, which plan he
is to forward to you by the Pamillus, I have to beg your
immediate attention to the same & to cause two of the
Frames to be finished with all possible dispatch &
Adam Griffith will be instructed to send them ready
any Transport that may be at Halifax. I beg leave
to submit to your consideration the propriety of the
being contracted for, as the Repairs of the Squadron during
the Summer Months will I suppose find full
employment for all the Artificers of the Yard.

I have by this opportunity sent to Rear Admiral
Griffith a plan for the Admirals house at Halifax in
which some additions have been made to the one formerly in
England & without them I make no doubt you will agree
with me that the house would have been inadequate to the
Residence of a Commander in Chief, & as the Season of the year
is now at hand for building in Stone I have to

request your assistance with such articles as you may find
from the Yard that I may be enabled to complete the same.
