I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 17th inst. respecting the 90th Regt. which shall be forwarded on to Halifax the moment it arrives here. but as I understand that Admiral Sir Francis Boscawen or his successor have received no orders to send on this Regt. to Bermuda which has been waiting within the transports sent out for its conveyance at the Newbern Islands since October last. Some apprehensions some mistake has arisen at home -
