 no one instance did I ever meet any distinction in
 the enforcement of the colonial duties to the statement
 made to the Victualling Board is totally a fabrication,
 made up for the purpose of clearing the contractors
 from penalty, which they have incurred in failing to
 comply with the terms of their contract.
