American Government not to agree to a general Exchange
of Prisoners with Great Britain, you will be pleased
to signify that it is my recommendation to send to
England all the American Prisoners now in this Country
unless British Prisoners for the purpose of exchanging
put on board Mr. Ship's Officer upon the coast of
America before the first day of June next;
I beg you will be pleased also to notify that it
do not mean this intimation merely as a threat for
I pledge my word of honor that the whole will be sent
to England unless there is a general exchange by the above
date for capturing those retained for Exchange, should the
