

As I conceive that independent of what Boats may be built in the naval yard of Halifax, a sloop might be built at the old Port from plans furnished from the yard. I request you will urge the Commissioners to get a sloop speedily completed, about the displacement of Yacht, but not to draw quite so much water. It will be required for the service upon the Coast.
