on auditing his accounts thereof. You will be pleased
therefore from time to time to audit his account of dis-
bursements, and approve of such bills as shall be
agreeably to the instructions contained in my last order
and as Mr. Grant may require to draw Bills upon the
Transport Board to supply himself of the means of making
purchases for the service of the Hospital which cannot
be obtained upon credit, it may be necessary to approve
of Bills near to what you suppose his disbursements will
amount to, upon account, to be given credit for in his
statement at the time of your auditing and approving
Bills for the balance upon his quarterly accounts, or the
accounts drawn up to such other limited periods, not
exceeding three months, as you may think proper.
