your local knowledge of the Port of New London, I leave it
entirely to yourself, whether or not it may be necessary to keep
Line of Battle Ship at anchor off that Port. By every oppor-
tunity which may offer for your communication with
you will forward the weekly state and condition of the
Ships and vessels under your orders, and you will direct
their Commanders to be careful in transmitting to me
their periodical Returns, and to send them weekly running
to me by every opportunity, either through you when it
may be practicable, or otherwise.
