Sir, I have directed Capt. Lundy to forward on the
Starfish under his command off the Delaware. I follow
your Order for the maintaining of a strict vigilance
of the Ports Harbors of that River & inform his arrival that
you will take him under your command & employ him
accordingly. I have ordered your Prize Sub. to
be purchased into the service & shall send her to you to
be employed as an Advice Boat in communicating any
intelligence which you may have to forward to me from
time to time. The Lieutenant Allen sent into Pennamond
in her shall be returned to you by the same conveyance. The
Starfish carries a Month's Provisions to you & you will employ
your Water upon any Part of the coast where you may be able
to do so with safety, or if this is not to be accomplished

Adam Griffith on this head I conceive you mean all the
Military Officers excepting those confined on the score of
