to return his application for a Court-Martial, which is
sent back to you herewith.

Sir M. Sherbrook's letter with the Petition of the Merchants
of Halifax.

I send you herewith my letter replying to
the Lieutenant General's Dispatch, left open for your
perusal, which after reading he pleased to put a stamp on
& forward to him.

1814. 17 May N^o 11. Answering my letter sent you
by the Arab & relating to Sir J.B. Sherbrook's application
respecting the exchange of Prisoners.

The former part of this letter will have acquainted
you of my wishes & instructions respecting the Exchange
of such Prisoners as are connected with the Army, of
course you will give what assistance may be requested
if it is necessary for carrying the conventions into effect as
far as relates to the Army, without any Exchange is
agreed upon by the American Government send over
Prisoners in advance, I am in hopes of being able to return
Halifax of 5 or 600 by the first conveyance.

A Schedule of letters written to you, with what
should have been affixed is sent herewith for your
information marked with their respective conveyances.

17 May 1814 N^o 12. Acquainting me of what you
had been able to ascertain respecting the claims set forth
by the Surgeons of the Cantoniers.

You will be pleased to send me any further information
that you may obtain respecting this Officer's claim for ransom
I am in hopes that I may be able to send them to him.
