Bermuda 9<sup>th</sup> June 1814

My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having directed to be transmitted to me a copy of a Letter of the 5<sup>th</sup> of March 1813 from Mr. Lippings then Master Shipwright of Chatham Yard, addressed to the Navy Board relating to His Majesty's Ship the 'Albion' which has been rebuilt upon his principles and suggested their directions to me to call upon you to make a full report, from time to time to be transmitted for their Lordships' information, upon the points adverted to in Mr. Lippings' letter, and upon the exact state of the Ship as connected with the peculiarities of her construction detailing every particular, your observations upon the strength and degree of her rigging, compared with other Ships and especially upon the state in which the new and old timbers that had been worked into the frame may have been affected by the process of the fire.
