Perseus 10th June 1844
Sir, You will be pleased to send
such a number of the Ships named in the Margin
forthwith to the Chesapeake directing their Commanders
to put themselves under the orders of the Senior Officer
there. If the Fleet is without a man you will
direct his being sent a sufficient number from
the Ships to navigate her, or that that Ship have
left Halifax, send the Fleet & Bow under some
proper Command, the Ship appropriated to which will
furnish the Fleet with men for her papers.
Please Mr. Griffiths. I have the honor to be, Sir,

If you can get any other ships for general or limited
service be pleased to put as many as you can send into
the Fleet. Should the Pelmeda be at Halifax
you will direct her proceeding immediately to Bermuda
for further orders.

Perseus 10th June 1844
Sir, Having received from Major Lewis
commanding the Marine Battalion, a letter acquaint-
ing me that the commanding Officer of the Regulars
refused to receive the rest of the Detachment landed from
that Ship, I have to express my surprise & disap-
probation of his conduct & especially of the reason assigned
for their not being received on board & I have to direct
that you cause all such sick & wounded of the Battalion
as the Surgeon thereof may think proper to send
on board, to be received into the Ship from which
they were landed & to be paid the same attention to as
any part of the Line, the Surgeon being allowed
