I have given permission to the Swedish Schooner ^{OSCAR} "Oscar" James Stewart Master, to take on board a number of Citizens of the United States, who have given their parole, and to proceed to the Blockading Squadron off New London, there to remain until proper authority shall come from the shore to receive them and their baggage the vessel not being suffered to enter any Port of the United States on pain of Capture. Upon this vessel's joining you, you will cause it to be signified to the Commissary for Prisoners of War at New London, that these Persons are on board upon Parole, and will be permitted to land provided receipts are obtained for them and assurances of their being exchanged, and

the Capt. Page upon your receiving such suffer them to land accordingly
