17th May, on the 3rd June last by the Dasher, informing me
that you had sent on board that Ship for Prisoners
-ten men, & to make up the number of Men retained
in your Squadron late belonging to the "Pitt" you
would endeavor to send ten more by the next oppor-
tunity. With reference to my letter of the 20th May
-pecting the Men sent here in the "Heron" they have
acquainted you that I want only the crew of the last
the Men composing which have yet to be tried by a
Court Martial for the loss of that Schooner & are particularly
required for a better description. The last
Men brought by the Dasher I have ordered to be sent
back in the "Hazard", of whose return to Barbados I
availed myself of to send on such Trade bound to the

Sir, As Capt. Pigot has acquainted you
with the situation of the Indian Nations & of
his proceedings I will not take up your time with

considerably extend the supplies to the Indian Tribes
this opportunity I send 600 Head of French
5000 cartridges & 1000 lbs of powder & will follow
