Sir, Having considered the representations contained in your letter of the 29th Ult. of the improper conduct of a Jackson, Master of the ship you command, upon the 26th Ult. I am induced to direct, that as the service would at present be much impeded by the appointment of a boat all that I have every hope from the statements you make of his general good conduct, he will be fully sensible of his error, your promise of his returning to his duty, provided however that he make a confession of his misbehaviour in the instance related in your letter & publicly apologize for the breach of discipline he was therein guilty of.
