Sir, I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt
of your letter of the 28th inst. regarding the
capture of the American Schooner "Kemples"
by British station under your command.
I am, Sir, very sorry to observe that Captains Porter & others
of the "Kemples" were permitted to enter New York
there on parole. You will in future prevent any
Persons being landed as it is most contrary to
orders - M.B.

Bermuda 27 July 1816
Sir my Secretary having by my direction called
on you officially on the 24 inst. to ascertain if you
could furnish him for the Service of the Squadron
under my command with the Cash required in my
former Letter and not having received any reply
thereto. I am to acquaint you that the Service
is experiencing a delay from your not answering
his communication and I request you will inform
me by return of the Deed whether the Department
under your direction can supply Cash to the amount
required, or any part thereof for the "Kemples"
that I may, in case of your not being able to do so,
take some other means and acquaint my Lord's Commissioners of your inability
to comply with the directions of the Treasury.
