R. O. Sir The Commander of His Majesty's Ship *Labrousse*
labouring under Complaints which would prevent her
serving in the Southern part of the Station and that she
being very short of Men, I have directed her proceeding
in her to Halifax, intending her to be an additional Ship
to the number before allotted to your Station. You will be
pleased therefore to take her under your Command and I
request that you will employ Captain ^{FINLEY} *Finley* on the Southern
part of the Station ^{during} the Hot Months and should
his health require his going to Sick quarters for a few
Weeks, put a Competent Officer to act in Command
of the *Row* while it may be necessary for him to remain
on shore.
