Lieutenant Colonel Brown and the officers
under his command have been placed, and
the additional expences to which they have been
subjected since their arrival in this country,
and to recommend your Excellency that they
may be granted such allowances as are
usually given on similar occasions.

The Lieutenant Colonel and the officers
under his command have at all times
voluntarily performed their services and having
been present in the different attacks have
aided to the utmost of their power, the very
active operations that have been carrying on
in the Chesapeake.
