amenable to a Court Martial - I shall
direct his being tried for his conduct towards
his Captain as stated in the Enclosure - or
should Captain Cochran arrive here as said
of the Junon or from the Ship to which he is
appointed at this port unless he makes
such an apology, you will order a Court
Martial to try him for the conduct before mentioned
