It is not my intention to retain the command
upon this Station longer than I continue
within its limits, and I shall acquaint
you of the period of my passing thence, in the
meantime you will continue to carry
into execution the various duties attached
thereto as heretofore.

Sir. I am commanded by His Admiral
the Hon. G. Sir C. Cochrane to acquaint you that he
will require as soon as you can possibly furnish
it eighty thousand Dollars (five thousand) for the
service of the Squadron under his command which
the Vice Admiral has directed me to receive and to
acknowledge by the usual Receipts bearing his
approval. Forty thousand of this sum I am
instructed to take on charge on account of the
Victualing Board and the remainder for the
Expenses of the Army Board departments and
as our stay here will not be above three days
after the present, the Commander in Chief will be
obliged by your appointing an early period for
its delivery and your informing me when I
shall send for the money.
