Fort Saint-Jacques 11 Nov 1814

Sir

I have the honor to inform your Excellency
that I purpose leaving this Anchorage tomorrow
morning for Jamaica - By a letter which I have
this moment received from Rear Ad^l Durham
he acquaints me that Transports were to have
sailed yesterday to take on board the 1st West India
Reg^t and bring it on to its destination, but
that he has no means whatever of sending down
the York Light Infantry - I have desired
the Rear Admiral to direct the Officer having
charge of these Transports to call off St Martin
to receive on board the Company of that Regiment
stationed there, and I would request of you that
direction might be sent to the Commanding Officer
to be ready to embark the moment the Transports
appear off -
