I have sent His Majesty's with the enclosed dispatches which announce the confirmation of the treaty of Peace by the President of the United States upon the 17th Ult. at 11. PM. Previous to my leaving the Havana I directed Rear Admiral Malcolm to return to Jamaica at the Ships that I had been obliged to employ during the expedition, substituting the *St. Peter* for the *Cydnes* which Ship is ordered to remain upon this Station as part of the Peace establishment, should the *Esperance* be with you I have to beg that she may be sent to Bermuda as Captain Duff's promotion may in some degree depend upon her arrival there before I proceed to England.
