I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letters numbers 5 and 6 of the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> February. — The Florida conveys to you a duplicate of my letter N<sup>o</sup>. 10. of the 6<sup>th</sup> Inst. Rear Admiral Levesque will have left this Coast before you can reach it, and the expedition therefore as are intended for Bonaire go direct there. The Florida is to take on board as much provision as she can stow and join you and to direct other vessels she may fall in with to do the same.

I hope however the supplies you have doubtless received by the Transport under convoy of the Edward and Cydnus will have enabled you to leave the boat for Havanna; where upon my arrival at Bonaire I will direct Victuallers to meet you lest you may not obtain the Provisions you require, from the accounts I have received from Jamaica I apprehend you cannot rely upon that Island for any supplies.
