Sir

I send you herewith the copies of two  
letters I have received from the Navy Board, the first  
containing their approval of my having directed the  
officers of the Bermuda Yard to furnish the necessary  
articles for fitting up Officers Sea for myself and the Captains  
of the Fleet; and the other stating that the Masters  
of His Majesty's Ships are entitled to full pilotage  
allowance for piloting ships to which they do not belong.

Sir

I have to desire that you will be pleased  
to audit and approve the accounts of the Naval Hospital  
at this port. And as the return to England of the  
Captains of the fleet imposes upon me at this period, a great

you approve of such demands for Stores as may be presented to  
you, limiting the same however to what may be absolutely  
required for the passage home of such ships as are ordered to  
England, and as you can supply consistently with the  
state of the stores. No Part is to be supplied for external purposes.
