- No 19 Dupl^y 10 Feb^r 1815 sending me a copy of a letter which Capt Jackson of the Sacedimonian wrote to you some time back respecting the capture of Lieutenant Jackson and some other Officers of the St. Lawrence
- No 25 27 February transmitting to me the copy of a report you had received from Captain Phelot of His Majesty's Sloop Rumor of his proceedings in a Service upon which you had directed him up the St. Marys River.
- No 27 28 February Enclosing the copy of a letter which you received some time back from the Governor of East Florida reclaiming in favor of an American Citizen, a vessel captured by the boats of the Spanish previous to your arrival at Cumberland Island together with a copy of your answer thereto
- No 30 13 March sending me copies of a correspondence between yourself and the American Generals Pinckney and Floyd respecting the termination of Hostilities between the two Countries and the cessation of offensive operations on your part and on theirs and acquainting me of your subsequent and final proceedings upon the Station committed to your charge, sending me also copies of orders which you had given the Commanders of the
