In reply to your letter of this date
informing me that Mr. Everard I. Cotgrave had
his appearance on board the *Sassex* with a
commission appointing him Lieut. of the *Marine*
that there were two confirmed Lieutenants
already on board, and both Admirally commissions
for her, and that Lieutenant Cotgrave was of the
latest date, and requesting to know ^{how} you are to act
therein I have to acquaint you that
Cotgrave's commission is of the latest date, he must
received, and supersede Lieut. Moxey, who it appears
was captured by the enemy on his way out to sea
up his commission for the *Sassex*, and afterwards
released and obtained his commission without
previously reporting his liberation to the Admiralty
upon which most probable Lieut. Cotgrave's
appointment took place. You will discharge
Moxey into any ship going home in order that
he may report his conduct to the Admiralty
