removed from these Islands together with an account of the
Stop clothing issued to them by your instruction of a full
you request my approval. — The accounts of Stop clothing
are returned herewith bearing my approval. —

You will be pleased to give directions to the Storekeeper
and to ascertain that these accounts of Stop be imme-
diately transmitted by him to the Navy Board.

30th March. Enclosing a copy of the contract entered into
with W. Till for the supplying of His Majesty's Ships at
this port with fresh Beef and Vegetables which is herewith
returned.
