

accept of my best acknowledgements for the interest which you have manifested upon this occasion and to receive my assurances of my being unacquainted with your appointment as His Majesty's Minister to the United States at the time of my addressing Mr Munroe, previous to the receipt of your before mentioned letter. I had seen the President's Message and Mr Munroe's report in an American paper and immediately dispatched a vessel of War to New Providence to convey to His Excellency Governor Cameron my earnest desire of his causing the most strict and scrupulous investigation to be made into the alleged proofs.

I have not a doubt however from the very statement appearing in Mr Munroe's reply and the seeming great desire to acquit the American Government of the obligation of establishing these accusations, that the whole has been fabricated without the smallest foundation.

Governor Cameron is requested to send you the earliest information of the result of his enquiry.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having sent out to my disposal two vessels laden with presents for the Southern Indians as is more fully expressed in some of the accompanying letters, also a quantity of clothing for the Corps who were intended that were intended to be raised had the War continued, a considerable part of which has been already delivered and the remainder ordered to be sent to this Island, I recommend your placing the Indian presents in charge of the Storekeeper of the Naval Yard on Ireland Island, subject to such future instructions
