Date From-To Abstract

- 22 June 1814 From Horsford requesting delay in sending Dep. Asst. Comm. Jail
- 23 June 1814 From Sherbrooke Congratulating him profusely as a result of letters A.C. sent on May 28 & 30. (evidently re Napoleon's defeat)
- 24 June 1814 From Capt Nash (saturu) re ~~not~~ redeploying Belvidera & Niemen.
- 25 June 1814 From Capt Jackson (Bacodemerian) re proceedings off Charleston
- 29 June 1814 From Brown requesting an additional water tank to be sent to Jamaica
- 29 June 1814 From Brown agreeing to leave Plantaganet Capt RM remain on N.A. State
- 29 June 1814 From Brown acknowledges receiving orders of blockade of U.S.
- 29 June 1814 From Geo Requests 400 seamen to man the new 3-decker by August. Americans have sent the crews of almost all their ships to Lake Ontario. He has no time to seek help from Admiralty
- 30 June 1814 To George Woodbine appointing him auxiliary Captain of the Colonial Marines to take charge of training the Creek Indians
- 1 July 1814 To Edward Nicolls appointing him Lt. Commandant of Colonial Marine Corps serving with Creek Indians as soon as he has recruited five hundred or more men.
- 8 July 1814 From Sherbrooke thanking him for sending the 102nd Regt Has sent transports with artillery to rendezvous. Capt. Seahouse has been appointed to lead the Service. [↓] Moosehead (ref ltr. of 19 June)
- 6 July 1814 From Horsford to implementing procedures to capture seamen deserted from Navy Ships by inspecting for "regular permit"
- 10 July 1814 From Hardy to ~~total~~ Pittington ^{Putnam} ultimatum to surrender Moosehead Island or face destruction of town of Eastport.
- 11 July 1814 From Pittington ^{Putnam} to Hardy - I surrender. plus articles of surrender and return of prisoners of war and Hardy's letter to Cochrane.
- 20 July 1814 ~~From~~ From Horsford transmitting letter from Capt. Cunningham (see ltr 18 Mar) Royal Engis re absence of Lt. Tenwick on Chesapeake.
- 21 July 1814 From Sherbrooke - has no dragon accoutrements, swords, carbines
- 30 July 1814 From Durham Sent 40 men, remainder of Pictou crew.
- 2 August 1814 From Sherbrooke acknowledges receipt of blockade order
- 3 August 1814 From Prevost reports defeat of Mills at Fort Erie, Chippewa & Cryslertown; subsequent victory by Lt. Gen. Drummond; and wanton destruction of property and mills by Americans; requests continued enforcement of policy of retaliation. Reports arrival of M. Guet Powers, Kaupt and Robins Brigades in Montreal.
