A Proclamation

Whereas the Right Honorable Sir John Borlase
Warren, did, by virtue of the power and authority
to him given, ~~exercise~~ and by his proclamation
bearing date at Halifax, the sixteenth day of
November 1813, declare that not only the ports
and harbors of the Cheapeake, Delaware, New York
Charleston, Port Royal, Savannah and the River
Mississippi, in the United States of America were,
and still continued in a state of ~~uninterrupted~~ ~~rigorous~~
blockade, but ~~that~~ also all that part of Long
Island Sound, being the sea-coast lying between
within Montauk Point and the point of land opposite
there, commonly called Black Point, together with
all the ports, harbors, creeks and entrances
of the North and East Rivers of New York, as well
as all other the ports creeks and bays along the
sea-coast of Long Island and the State of New York,
and all the ports, harbors, rivers and creeks, lying
