Barbadoes 14th May 1814

I have received your letter of the 26th ultimo with the order for the Blockade of the Eastern Ports of the United States which I shall make known exactly to your directions.

I took upon myself to owe protection to the 9th Regiment to Halifax - the Gloucester has left this with the Transport on board of which it is embarked. We sailed with them on the 5th instant.

I think right to mention that Captain Dowers placed Barbadoes with my Despatches but failing in with a Brig at St Vincent sent them to me by her. I understand this officer is in the habit of doing so.

Your Cypher Communication I have not received probably owing to the inattention of Captain Dowers.
