obliged them to take shelter in the marshes
near Pensacola with little or no provisions;
that they went to consult the House of Mr. Forbes
would send Twenty five or Thirty head of cattle
to prevent them from starving and enable them to
join their countrymen on the Appalachicola.

I immediately directed Captain Woodbine to
purchase such cattle as were absolutely ne-
cessary for their relief and gave him the ap-
pointment of British Agent for the Creek
stations until your pleasure was known, with
Orders to take charge of the Arms & Ammunition
& Stores supplied from the Ordnance a List
of which Sir I beg to enclose, with a
plan of the River, and such information
as could be procured.

I have also the honor to
enclose a letter from the Indian Chiefs in
answer to your dispatches, and am
