 26 Sept. 1814 - 16 May 1815

Date	From	Abstract
30 Oct 1814	Croker	- sending "Castor" to Bermuda for his fleet.
3 Oct 1814	Croker	- have ordered all ships sailing to Bermuda or to join him to take on board 2 flat boats and as many gigs or other boats as they can stow.
4 Oct. 1814	Croker	- sending a published paper of 1807 re signals for ships in sight of and supposed to be bound for Newbury Port. Enclosure shows it applies to harbor where pilots can't get out.
5 Oct. 1814	Croker	- orders to send Mid. Charles Legge home.
6 Oct. 1814	Croker	- Parole of prisoners by individuals, officers etc. is null & void and he is to so notify his officers.
6 Oct 1814	Croker	- commending Colburn's zeal & gallantry on the Chesapeake
6 Oct 1814	Croker	- sending one Bolton and Watts rolling copying machine
6 Oct 1814	Croker	- trans Referring to your letter 112 of 3 Sept stating of <i>Amelia</i> <i>June</i> & <i>??</i> <i>see 28 Sept</i> asking you appointed Messrs Gray Johnston, and Sanders <i>obv</i> acting Lts. rather than sub-Lt., they cannot be confirmed (Endorsed by A.C., will find officers to command the vessels)
10 Oct 1814	Croker	- sending a box of 16 sets of telegraphic signals
10 Oct 1814	Croker	- commissions for Kerr & Burton to command <i>Tonnant</i> & <i>Voltaire</i>
14 Oct 1814	Barrow	- sending "Iphigenia" for his fleet.
15 Oct 1814	Barrow	- sending 10 telegraphic signal books on "Venezian"
17 Oct 1814	Barrow	- " 6 additional " " " " "
18 Oct 1814	Barrow	- send <i>Venezian</i> back with a convoy, unless a ship of-line is returning in which case may retain her.
19 Oct 1814	Barrow	- 6 Capt's and 8 subalterns R.M. being sent for shore duty ^{in America}
19 Oct 1814	Barrow	- Expressing great pleasure at the victory at <i>Baltimore</i> and awarding many promotions including James Scott to cdr. & Capt Roberts to ^{Bravet} Major ^{Major}
19 October 1814	Barrow	- Expressing "high approbation" of Capt. Gordon's capture of <i>Alexandria</i> and Fort Washington etc. with several promotions of officers.
19 Oct 1814	Barrow	- orders 1 st Lt. of Helms to stand court martial for neglect of duty in allowing ship to leave Plymouth short 34 men
19 Oct 1814	Barrow	- dissolves his appointment of acting Lt. for <i>Diadem</i> and requires he select someone from <i>Admiral</i> list of mid's.
