Date From Abstract

- 19 Oct 1814 Barrow Acknowledges receipt of correspondence through 22 Sept. and refers him to separate answers (above & below).
- 20 Oct 1814 Barrow In recognition of his services in organizing the Colonial Corps of Marines Sgt. W^m Hammond is promoted to 2nd Lt. of 39th Co. RM at Plymouth and may be employed by you as ^{necessary}.
- 20 Oct 1814 Barrow - Send master mate of Pythias to England to stand court martial on charge of cruelty to Marine.
- 21 Oct 1814 Barrow - Regiments of "Vengeur" are being sent direct to Pt. Negre.
- 21 Oct 1814 Barrow - Reassigns capt. of "Rover" to another ~~ship~~ sloop.
- 22 Oct 1814 Barrow - York Chasseurs being sent direct to Jamaica.
- 22 Oct 1814 Barrow - Take accompanying dispatch vessel under your command.
- 22 Oct 1814 Barrow - Authorizes additional expenditures to provide better food ~~transmission~~ for "great increase" of sick and wounded.
- 22 Oct 1814 Barrow - Sending out 2 lts. for his use.
- 24 Oct 1814 Barrow - Sends commissions of John Dundas Cochrane as CO of Dorset plus several other promotions.
- 24 Oct 1814 Barrow - After arrival in Bermuda Levin is to return to England.
- 24 Oct 1814 Barrow - sends 4 commissions.
- 24 Oct 1814 Barrow - sending 4 capt. & subalterns, 30 NCO's RM via Statira.
- 25 Oct 1814 Barrow - fill vacancies caused by promotions of Capt Sullivan of ~~the~~ "Hesper" and Alexander of "Devastation" to post capt. and Lt. Herbert of "Euryalus" to cdr. from men on Adm^{ty} list.
- 25 Oct 1814 Barrow - sending out on Statira \$5000 under custody of Robt. Gamble ^{of Victoria Regia} to be used to purchase fresh meat and vegetables.
- 22 Oct 1814 Admiralty - have reviewed court-martial sentence of death for Jonathan Partrian for throwing a seaman to death from the fore yard, and mitigating circumstances lead them to order his pardon, after he shall have been brought to deck and heard the preliminary formalities for execution.
- 25 Oct 1814 Barrow - Regarding his complaint of inadequate replenishment of troops lost from casualties and fact that ships bringing replacements consume up to half of them for their own use, provides a list of 1100 men sent in last 6 mos. and expresses regret he did not identify the ships mentioned since they were all sent complete.
