Date From-To Abstract

- 2 April 1814 Cochran - Re seizure of ^{Portuguese} slave ships from Portuguese territory to Brazil be prohibited, all others OK to sent to court.
- 12 Feb. 1814 Barrow - Pilots are to be paid by bills drawn on storekeeper at Quebec.
- 12 Feb 1814 Barrow - No prisoners held for retaliation are to be removed.
- 9 Feb 1814 Cochran - Revising schedule of convoys to-from England (~monthly)
- 12 Feb. 1814 Barrow - Resident commissioners abroad may not order a convoy.
- 19 Feb 1814 Barrow - Man who falsely confessed to murder and a "witness" are being returned from England to "Orachue" and confessor is to be "punished at the gangway" per custom of the service.
- 22 Feb 1814 Barrow - In answer to his request submit about twenty pages of regulations covering granting of licenses to trade with US but remind him he has no power to grant them.
- 22 Feb 1814 Barrow - Navy Board will not require captains to issue ^{pilotage} bills to storekeeper at Quebec but will pay them directly.
- 23 Feb 1814 Barrow - granting a pension of 2 shillings/day to a former pilot.
- 3 March 1814 Barrow - Instructions re transfer of responsibility for ships companies and maintaining log of age of cables etc.
- 7 March 1814 Barrow - Stating Adm. Warren has ordered his ships "Endymion" and "Statira" not to accept challenge ~~to come to action~~ by "United States" and "Macedonian" to come to action without the aid of other ships since the British force is so much superior; and the Admiralty fully concurs and orders him to do likewise.
- 7 Mar. 1814 Barrow - Capt. Knight of Rumulus should send his ^{quarterly} report of officers and punishments through you not directly to Admiralty.
- 2 Mar 1814 Barrow - Notifying him a residence for a ship to be built at Halifax.
- 7 Mar 1814 Barrow - requests him to advise if Warren's plan to bear six of the oldest, most pilots on yard wages, is acceptable to him.
- 10 Mar 1814 Barrow - ordering him to decide if it is appropriate to honor request of Gov. ^{St. James} ^{enclosed} that navy supply boats for civil govt are.
- 10 Mar 1814 Barrow - asking he have R. Adm. Cochrane systematically inspect "Albion" which has just been rebuilt by Seppings, who requests regular feedback of her conditions. (Enclosure)
