- Feb 1815	Gordon	Asking him to contact the Adm ^t re claims of merchants of Alexandria for property he seized, saying they had agreed to the terms & he had been following orders. Includes a large number of enclosures regarding the claims and counterclaims. With detailed estimates of losses at Washington by both the Americans and British, a list of casualties at the battle of Washington (p. 78) that addresses wounded left at Bladensburg, those who fell out during the march and those blown up and killed, and prior cases of remuneration for property taken by Nelson, Exmouth etc.

12 Sept 1814	Cochrane to Brooke	transcribed Acknowledges info re Ross' death, and immediately addresses that his policy of retaliation allows for <u>contributions</u> to be made
