Cadiz Oct 17<sup>th</sup> 1812,

Sir,

The Vice Consul of the United States of America has represented to the Regency of the Kingdom, that the English Brig, *Charles* had captured at the Entrance of this Port in the Spanish Territory, the American Ship *Miser* proceeding from Boston with a Cargo of Flour, and His Highness commands me to inform Your Excellency of this, satisfied that if the Exposition of the Vice Consul shall be found to be correct, you will give the necessary orders that the captured ship may be restored to her Owners.
