I have received your letters of the dates and numbers in the margin, with their several enclosures, and most highly approve of the arrangements you have made and the orders you have given since your arrival at Cadix.

If the shipwrights sent from England to Cadix, are not wanted at that place, or Gibraltar; I desire they may be sent to England by the first opportunity.

Your will with this Letter receive directions for the disposal of the Junk Boats, and of the Officers and Crews belonging to them. I wish Captain Carrol to be kept with the division of boats at Gibraltar, Captain Thomas is at liberty to go to Sir Edward Pellew, or to return to England upon leave, which ever he may think best.

Whenever any of His Majesty's Ships can be spared from the necessary Services at Cadix, and its neighbourhood, I desire they may be ordered here to join me. I would have one ship of war kept cruising near S. Vincent, the best Ships to employ
