

The Calendar day beginning at Midnight is to be used with these day signals.

Weekdays - Fore or Main top mast head -

Monday } The first signal made is - { Pendant over flag  
 Tuesday } { Yellow blue fly  
 Wednesday } Answered by - { Pendant over flag  
 Thursday } { Yellow black border  
 Friday } The first signal made is - { Pendant under flag  
 Saturday } { white blue cross  
 Sunday } Answered by - { Pendant under  
 { Yellow blue fly

NB. When Pendant is not mentioned, Flag is implied.

The Nautical day beginning at Noon is to be used with these Night signals.

The first signal made by burning two false fires - Answered by showing three lights of equal height.

The vessel first making the signal is then to show two lights one over the other. The other to reply by burning one false fire.

The vessel that is first hailed (and the ship which hailed is to answer - "Bath" reply - "Richmond")
