

of that Ship an Old and an experienced Officer, one of the Men on board the Schooner had both his Arms so dreadfully shattered by a raking shot, that the moment he arrived on board this Ship both were immediately amputated, and I am sorry to add the poor man is since dead. The Schooner upon this struck, and proves to be the Armed Letter of Marque Cora of eight guns and forty Men, Two hundred and fifty eight Tons, Coppered and Copper fastened, her first Voyage, and esteemed the fastest Schooner out of Baltimore from Bourdeaux, laden with Brandy, Wine, Silk & Flints &c in a Cargo of great amount; I am happy to add the Squadron suffered no loss upon this occasion from the fire of the Cora's guns.

I cannot Sir say too much in praise of every Officer and man of the Squadron you did me the honor to place under my Command, all vie with each other, who shall do the most to put your orders into full force, and it gives me great pleasure to see such a spirit of emulation among the Squadron in the American Waters.
