

in joining me at this Anchorage with  
all the Ships under your Orders, excepting  
a Division of three or four Frigates to attend  
the Enemy's motions the Senior Captain  
of which, is to be directed to detach a Ship  
to me at this Island, upon his ascertaining  
the point to which the Enemy's attention  
appears to be directed or the place whither  
he may be destined.

10<sup>th</sup> You will direct the several Captains to  
hold as little communication as  
possible with any Americans whether  
Inhabitants on the Coast, Pilots or  
others, and to prevent the same in all  
Officers and persons under them, in  
Order to avoid corruption, seduction or  
the seeds of sedition being sown.

11<sup>th</sup> Whenever a certain number of Prizes  
are collected, either at the Chesapeake or  
Delaware, I recommend that they  
should be sent in Convoys under a  
Frigate, which on her arrival here may  
be completed in Stores ~~stores~~ Provisions  
and Water and carry back the Crews of  
the several Captures to the Ships they  
respectively belong to.
