Having received information that
a considerable number of the Enemy's Armed
Vessels and others are assembled in Pasanook
and Ceracoke Inlets;

Nomulus
Fox
Nemesis
Conflict

Cockenfer

You are hereby ordered and
directed to take the Ships and Vessels named
in the Margin under your Orders, with the
Troops under the Command of Lieut^{nt}
Col^{el} Napier, and proceed with them
Off the aforesaid Ports; when you will
endeavour to capture or destroy the
Enemy; and having so done use
your utmost exertions in rejoining me
at this Anchorage or in Lynhaven Bay.

You are upon no account to
continue longer on this Service than
is absolutely necessary, nor to allow any
of the Ships with you to separate, as
the Troops on board of them will be
wanted for other Service which cannot
be carried into Execution until the
return of the Ships under your Orders.
