Memorandum of

Instructions for the Royal Marines on Ireland Island.

An Officers Guard to be paraded at an early hour every morning, from whence the detachments from the out Ports are to be relieved.

The Guard for the Dockyard should consist of a Sergeants Party and the Centinels placed round the avenues to the yard. A Corporals Party should likewise be placed at the extremity of the Island opposite the narrows to prevent either smugglers or Deserters from passing to the other Islands.

Directions and injunctions that a regular Officers Guard should be mounted every day, and for Guards at the East End of the Islands near the narrows, and Centinels placed at the Crawls and Mast Yard.

A Guard of three Men at Fullhams and also at Ports Island to protect the Timber, Tanks, House, live Stock &c and not to suffer any Injury or depredation to be
