All General Reports and State of the Guard and Troops to be sent by the Officer of the Marines to the Commodore or Admiral at the Anchorage who will also give the daily Parole & Countersign.

Working Parties from the Marine Troops under the direction of an Officer of that Corps to be allowed when required for the service of the yard and Stores; and the usual allowance to the Officer and Men so employed to be paid them by the Storekeeper.
