2	4	W. S. W.		Saw a strange Sail N.W. At 9 Tacked Ship. Shortened Sail, and hove to, detained the Brig, Cidade de Lisboa, under Portuguese Colors from Lisbon bound to New York. Laden with Oranges and Lemons also the American Schooner Hannan from Charlestown bound to Eastport laden with Rice and Corn. Boarded the Spanish Brig Genl Ballesteros from the Havannah bound to Baltimore, warned her not to proceed.
